opportunity to find their path and discover who they are as individuals. Our goal is to customize our students' high school journey, so they have access to the postsecondary options that best fit their future aspirations.





24/7 student access to eBooks and scholarly databases expand the library beyond the physical, reaching our learners when and where they need them.

Academics

What is the minimum number of classes I must take as a freshman?

Freshmen are required to take a minimum of 6 classes. Students who may wish can take seven classes, but it is strongly recommended to maintain balance when starting your first year of high school.

What is a typical freshman schedule at **PVHS?**

A typical freshman schedule is English, Math, Science, World Language, PE/Sport, and Elective such as World History, Visual/ Performing Arts, or another elective.

What is a Four-Year Plan?



Your assigned counselor will work with you to develop and monitor your Four-Year plan. A Four-Year Plan is an outline of courses that a high school student will take to complete the necessary requirements for graduation and meet their post-secondary goals. It is a working document; it can change each year! Counselors can work with you and your student to assist in developing your individual four-year plan.



I took a World Language elective in middle school, does it count for credit in high school?

Yes and no. Classes taken in middle school do not appear on the high school transcript. It is strongly recommended that you complete two or more years of your foreign language in high school regardless of how many years taken in middle school. UCs and CSUs will look at the level you completed as your total number of years completed.

Can I take summer school to get ahead?

Summer school is an option for students who wish to take certain classes to make room for other programs or classes they are involved in to make everything fit in their schedule. There are limitations to what can be taken over the summer. Counselors can work with individual students to identify appropriate summer school options.

Extracurriculars and Student Life

How do I get involved on campus? How do I join a club? There are over 70 clubs on campus in addition to many other activities and leadership organizations. Each fall, there is Club Rush which takes place in Sea King Park. Students have an opportunity to walk around and explore the different club offerings and talk with club presidents about what their club has to offer and sign up. We encourage our students to get involved and be part of the clubs that make an impact on campus and in the community.

How important are extracurricular and volunteer activities?

It is very important to get involved on campus and in your community. It is recommended that you pick a few clubs or organizations to expand your involvement with. Colleges will evaluate what you do outside of the classroom almost as much as how you did in the classroom. Colleges want to know what impact you've had on your community, what is important to you, and what shapes you as a person. Community service is not a graduation component.

How do I apply for specialized programs such as ASB or BTC?

We have two leadership programs, ASB (Associated Student Body) and BTC (Be the Change), which students apply for. Incoming Freshmen will have an opportunity to apply to be part of the BTC Leadership class with applications and interviews in the spring of eighth grade. If freshmen students are interested in an ASB Officer position, they may run when school starts next fall.


Sports and Physical Education

What is the PE requirement? Can my sport count as my PE? Do colleges count PE? The state of California requires high school students to complete two years of PE. Our students take PE in their 9th and 10th grade years. Students who play a sport and are on a team may use their sport to fulfill their PE requirement. PE/Sport is not a requirement for college applications, so they do not look at this; it is a high school graduation requirement only.

What percentage of students are on a sports team at PVHS? Are there non-cut sports available? Approximately 55% of Sea Kings are involved in a sports team at PVHS. There are several non-cut sports teams available for students to join. These include football, cross country, girls basketball, girls water polo, track, boys and girls lacrosse, softball, and swim.

Can I play on more than one sports team?

Yes. We have many multi-sport athletes who chose to play more than one sport while in high school. Students may play more than one sports so long as the sports are in different seasons (fall, winter, spring). For example, a student may play football in the Fall and baseball in the Spring. 37

What is Block Schedule?

- Six class periods divided into two alternating days
- A Days Periods 1, 2, 3
- B Days Periods 4, 5, 6
- Over the course of two weeks, students attend five (5) A Days and five (5) B Days
- Zero (0) Period meets every day for 55 minutes
- Block periods are 115 minutes long

What are the benefits of **Block Schedule?**

Signature Programs and Elective Classes

What is the PVIT Pathway?

The PVIT Pathway allows students to take specific science courses and engineering courses together. Freshmen students have the option to take Introduction to Engineering Design and Development as their elective and Physics as their Science class. This is followed by Digital Electronics, then Aerospace Engineering, and finally Engineering Design and Development. The Engineering Advanced Projects program is available any academic year the student wishes to participate in the Sunday PVIT program.

What is AVID? If my child is in AVID, how does that affect their schedule throughout high school?

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. It is an elective program designed to support students who traditionally receive Bs and Cs and are in need of strategies and skills in the area of study skills, writing, notetaking and organization. Students who apply for and are accepted into AVID will have AVID as an elective course on their schedule all four years of high school. It is possible to take AVID each year and still meet all the other high school graduation requirements as well as college entrance requirements. Some students elect to take summer school classes to lighten their school load in some years.

What do "Electives" mean in high school?

Electives are courses that exceed the minimum graduation requirements and typically include academic courses taken to meet college entrance requirements. For example, only two years of math is required for PVPUSD graduation, which is typically met in 9th and 10th grade. Math courses taken in 11th and 12th grades will count as high school elective classes, as well as meeting the college entrance requirements for math. 70 Elective credits are required for graduation and your counselor will work your students to ensure they are meeting the required number of credits.



Support Services at PVHS

How will I be assigned a school counselor? How does a school counselor work with high school students?

Students are assigned their counselor by student last name. Students are with the same counselor for all four years of high school. Counselors are available by drop in, email, request for an appointment, and they make visits to classrooms to deliver guidance lessons to all grade levels. Counselors are available to support students with academic, college and career planning, as well as social, emotional, and mental health support.

What other mental health supports are available at PVHS?

PVHS has two Student Support Specialists provided by SAGE. They provide school-based therapy to students to identified students who are struggling with social-emotional concerns, as well as mental health services to students by offering free therapy to students during school hours. SAGE therapists meet with students individually and through group counseling.
